As legal counsel for People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals, Matthew Penzer has produced groundbreaking work in the fight to advance the status and protection of animals under the law. His cutting edge work includes successful lawsuits against KFC for making false claims about the treatment of chickens and the District of Columbia when it attempted to exclude PETA's suffering "circus" elephant from a public art display. On any given day, Penzer is dealing with issues involving administrative law, constitutional law, business law, or any other area of practice that might be utilized to protect animals. He has argued for the animals on MSNBC, Fox News Channel, CNN, and dozens of other television and radio programs. Headlines about his lawsuits have appeared in scores of papers across the country.
